Or you could simply soak in the beauty of nature, as you walk in the coniferous forests of the Himalayas. One can even visit the Gurdwara Manikaran Sahib and Tosh, a village known for its quaint wooden houses.

Once the hub for off-the-grid beach parties and water sports like parasailing, banana boat rides and jet skiing, Gokarna is opening up more of its isolated beaches to beach treks, as they are called. Most of the beaches here are surrounded by rocky outcrops and cliffs, so you can take a jungle trail that leads to a vantage point on the beach for dolphin spotting, or trek through a boulder-strewn trail to reach the Rock of Peace. Whatever it is that catches your fancy, you will be spoilt for choice when it comes to choosing your New Year adventure in this hippie town with character.


